MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Locally, The SA Listed Property Index (SAPY) and the All Property Index (ALPI) recorded total returns of 2.15% and 2.49% respectively for the month of August, with the historic yield of the SAPY ending the month at 8.7%. The yield-to-maturity (YTM) on the Long-Term South African government bond (RLRS) de-rated by 39 bps, ending the month at 9.18% (8.79% -31 July 2018). Volatility in emerging market economies saw their currencies weaken relative to major developed market currencies. The Rand weakened by between 9%-11% to the US Dollar, British Pound and Euro during the month, which subsequently lead to the outperformance of dual listed real estate companies. Capital & Regional (21.54%), Schroeders (15.72%), Nepi Rockcastle (14.75%), Investec Australia (13.81%), Stenprop (13.40%) and Greenbay(10.94%) all outperformed the SAPY and ALPI during the month of August.

Globally, the FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Developed Net Rental Index, recorded a net total USD return of 1.48% in August. The best performing listed real estate market was the US, which recorded a total USD return of 2.74%. The UK recorded the lowest total USD return for the month of -3.00%.

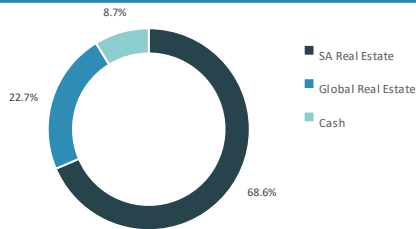
Global real estate fundamentals overall remain healthy, mainly due to manageable supply levels relative to demand, with an improved economic growth outlook. Taking the estimated forward FAD (Funds Available for Distribution) yield of 4.73%, and medium-term growth prospects into account, listed real estate currently looks fairly valued on a risk-adjusted basis. Over the long term, we expect the SA listed sector to deliver approximately 13% – 15% total return in ZAR driven by its core drivers being income yield and capital return from distribution growth. The Fund's offshore allocation is approximately 55% on a see-through basis.

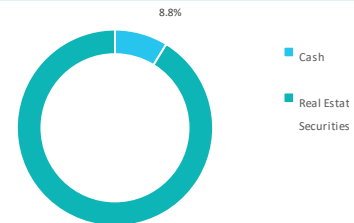
