MONTHLY COMMENTARY AS AT 31 JANUARY 2018

The FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Developed Rental Index recorded a net total USD return of -1.38% in January. The best performing listed real estate market was Japan, which recorded a total USD return of 8.98%. The U.S. recorded the lowest total USD return for January of -4.18%. Having concluded the first month of 2018, it is evident that as we extend further into the post-crisis recovery, at the forefront of real estate investors' minds are the gradual moderation of currently healthy earnings growth, rising interest rates, and the implementation and assimilation of tax reform. Barring unforeseen macro shocks, it is apparent that central banks are progressing towards raising interest rates. The yield spread between interest rates on treasuries and listed real estate leads us to believe that the market has pre-empted and attempted to price-in future hikes. The majority of management teams have used this low-rate period as an opportunity to fix their cost of debt funding at attractive levels and extend their maturity profiles. Additionally, if economic growth and inflation underly rising interest rates, then real estate should benefit from upside in their tenants' earnings growth and be able to capture rising inflation through inflation-indexing components within lease structures.

Looking ahead, the retail outlook remains challenging, particularly in the U.S., as retailers reduce footprints through store closures and bankruptcies occur. Retailers are likely to receive some relief at the margin from tax reform as they retain more earnings and rising consumers' disposable income increases consumption. Retail real estate companies have been trading at large discounts to net asset values, which has spurred on consolidation and privatisations in the mall space. The assets targeted have been high quality, productive assets indicating that long-term investors see value in the space.

Amongst major asset classes, the U.S. industrial sector has displayed the strongest fundamentals supported by traditional warehouse users as well as e-commerce tenants. Additional space requirements related to distribution and fulfilment, coupled with an increasing online market share capture of total retail sales, will continue to provide a tailwind for industrial landlords. Supply in certain markets is increasing and net absorption is expected to slow, however fundamentals remain favourable.

Despite a recent reacceleration in office leasing activity, U.S. office fundamentals remain challenging for landlords. A lower corporate tax rate and the repatriation of capital held offshore has the potential for reinvestment into productive capital and new jobs, which could provide impetus to company profits. However, given that the economy is essentially at full employment, the pace of job growth is expected to slow. In combination with increasing supply in select markets and decreasing square footage per office using employee as landlords rationalise space, this presents a headwind. Pricing of assets in private, gateway markets screen as expensive, incentivising investors to look to non-gateway markets. Assets in gateway cities should remain in high demand from foreign investors, however secondary markets such as those in the Sunbelt are increasingly attracting investor interest. Medium-term earnings growth prospects for global real estate stocks remain relatively robust due to the lag effect of long-term leases and solid operating fundamentals. Listed real estate currently trades at an estimated forward FAD (Funds Available for Distribution) yield of 4.88%. Considering current global real estate market fundamentals, pricing appears fair to slightly attractive on a long-term risk-adjusted basis.

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

This specialist fund offers real estate focus, with global diversification. The real estate focus is through real estate securities with a specific bias towards stocks classified as investors, as opposed to developers. The investor classification is defined as those stocks that have 70% or more of their income derived from rent. The guiding principle is the ownership of real estate assets, primarily to earn rental related income streams which provide a stable underpin to long term returns. Global diversification is across geographic regions, currencies, countries and real estate types. The intention is to provide an attractive risk-adjusted return to form part of a multi asset class portfolio.

The fund benchmark is the FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Developed Rental Index, which comprises of stocks in the following regions: United States, Canada, UK, Europe, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia and New Zealand.

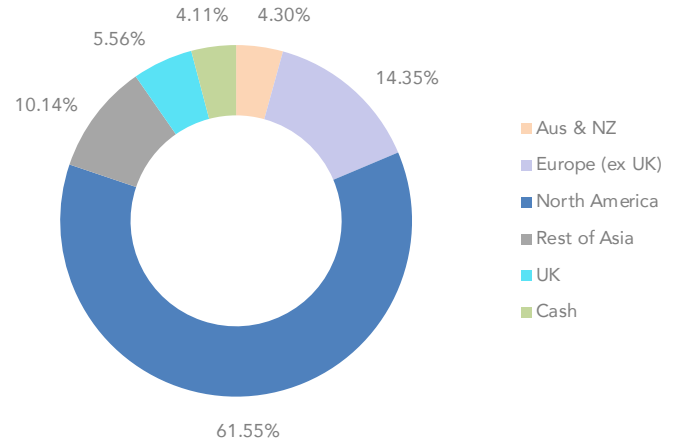

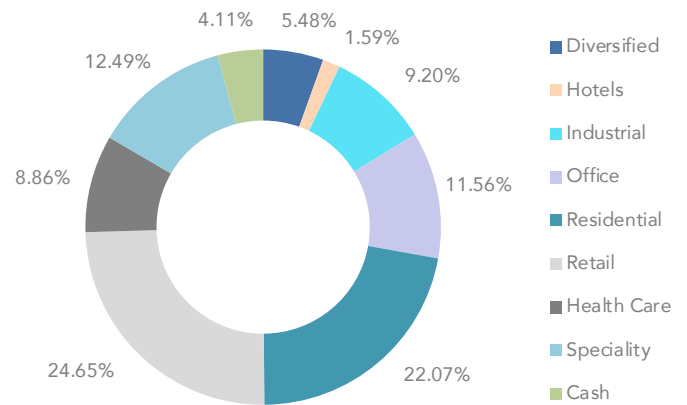

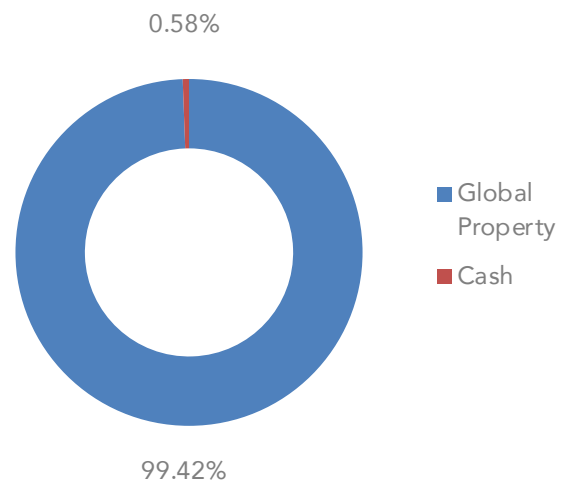
Underlying Funds Geographic Allocation as at 31 January 2018
