## MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Locally, the SA Listed Property Index (SAPY) recorded a total return of 7.68% for the month of April with the historic yield of the SAPY ending the month at 7.61%. The property sector outperformed equities (5.40%), cash (0.62%) and bonds (-0.68%). The sector's strong performance was in spite of a sell-off in bonds as the ongoing back and forth in the US and China trade war sent jitters across emerging markets. On a rolling 12-month basis, the property sector's total return is slightly shy of breakeven at -0.45%. The forward yield of the SAPY at month end was 8.08% whilst the yield-to-maturity (YTM) on the Long-Term South African government bond (RLRS) de-rated by 20 bps, ending the month at 8.38% (8.18% -31 March 2018). The Fund delivered -6.11% gross of fees total return in ZAR for the 12 months ended 30 April 2018, whilst the benchmark return in ZAR was 8.09%.

Globally, the FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Developed Rental Index recorded a net total USD return of 1.52% in April. The best performing listed real estate market was Hong Kong, which recorded a total USD return of 4.29%. Japan recorded the lowest total USD return for April of -0.21%.


Global real estate fundamentals overall remain healthy, largely due to relatively low supply and an improved economic growth outlook. Taking the estimated forward FAD (Funds Available for Distribution) yield of 4.90%, and medium-term growth prospects into account, listed global real estate currently looks about fairly valued on a risk-adjusted basis. The current forward yield of the SAPY is 8.08% with an expected distribution growth of 6.1% over the next 12 months, driven largely by high growth offshore counters. In the long term, we expect the SA listed sector to deliver 12 – 15% total return in ZAR driven by its core drivers being income yield and capital return from distribution growth. The Fund's offshore allocation is approximately 54% on a see-through basis.


